Lourdes Administration Announces New Athletics Leadership



In September 2022, the OLLHS Administration announced that Matthew Petruzzelli and Richard Curran would assume leadership of the Lourdes Athletics Program.

Matthew Petruzzelli moved into the position of Athletic Director of the Lourdes Program servicing the varied and expansive athletic needs for over forty teams and five hundred student athletes. Originally hailing from

New Paltz, New York, Mr. Petruzzelli grew up playing Section IX basketball at New Paltz High School, leading the team to a section title in 2008 and where his name is proudly displayed in the gymnasium for scoring over 1000 points during his high school career. He continued his basketball career at Keene State College in New Hampshire where he earned a Bachelor of Science.

This role will provide strategic leadership and vision to the OLLHS Department of Athletics, including but not limited to developing and implementing policies, procedures, and an organizational structure for the department that ensures its administrative and operational effectiveness, budget management, compliance, and day-to-day operations.

Mr. Petruzzelli's experiences as a coach and educator at OLLHS have prepared him for this next step as Athletic Director. He has served the OLL student body for seven years as a teacher of Physical Education, a Physical Education Department Coordinator, and an assistant to the Athletic Director. He is thrilled to pour his passion and energy into continuing to grow Lourdes athletics and create the best opportunities possible for the Lourdes student-athletes. The students, colleagues, and Lourdes families who know "Coach P" will say that he cares deeply about the student body, both on and off the courts and fields on which they compete. A great communicator, exceptional listener, and steadfastly fair individual, Mr. Petruzzelli possesses all of the qualities of an apt leader. The OLL student-athletes are in great hands.

In November 2022, Mr. Petruzzelli was joined by an Associate Athletic Director, Richard Curran. Mr. Curran joins the Warriors after numerous years of experience in athletics at the high school, collegiate, and professional levels. This position's primary mission is to ensure that our student-athletes, coaching staff, and administrators are provided with first class support and resources necessary to be academically and athletically successful while in total compliance with all NYSPHSAA & Section IX rules and regulations.



Most recently Mr. Curran was an Assistant Football Coach and Assistant Strength Coordinator at SUNY Cortland. During the 2021 season Curran saw success helping the team to an Empire 8 Conference championship and playoff appearance. Prior to Cortland, Mr. Curran also had administrative and athletic

leadership positions at Stonehill College and Massachusetts Maritime Academy, where he not only coached, but also held the titles of Assistant Equipment Manager, Events Coordinator, and Recruiting Coordinator.

Before moving into the college ranks, Mr. Curran spent time at his alma mater, Red Bank Catholic High School and St. James Elementary School (Red Bank, NJ). During his tenure, Mr. Curran coached both football and boys basketball, while also teaching in both schools. Mr. Curran was a Lacrosse and Football standout at Red Bank Catholic. Mr. Curran also had experience being a part of the Miami Dolphins organization of the National Football League.

A graduate of Saint Anselm College, where he lettered for four years in the Hawks football program and earned his Bachelor of Arts in Psychology. He also completed his Master of Science degree in Global Sports Business from Rutgers University with an emphasis in Sports Leadership and Administration.

Both Mr. Petruzzelli and Mr. Curran will represent OLLHS at Section meetings and are very eager to serve, support and contribute to the good work of Our Lady of Lourdes High School as well as Section IX.

"Jane's Healing Heart, Mind & Soul Center" Opens for Students



On Friday, October 7th the Powers Family joined our school community for the official blessing and dedication of a new room for students in memory of their sister, Jane, from the OLL Class of 1980.

Jane's brothers, Jim '70 and Tom '75, along with Jim's daughter and Tom's niece, Liz, attended the blessing and dedication. The day began with a school-wide liturgy for the Feast of the Our Lady of the Rosary that included many of the school's benefactors. Jane's longtime friends Sara Rappleyea Johnson '80 and Amy Prisco-Ring '86 also made the trip to be a part of this moment. After Father Connolly celebrated Mass, invited guests attended this blessing and dedication and then enjoyed each other's company during a Benefactor's Reception.

This new center has been created to provide a safe area for those students who are overwhelmed with the fast-paced and pressure-filled experience of high school. Jane's Healing Heart, Mind & Soul Center offers an area of contemplation for students to slow down their minds, bodies, and souls and focus calmly on their breathing and well-being. This space assists in alleviating anxiety, worry, and concern throughout the school day. It also provides a comfortable area that is designed to include all of the tools that have been researched by mental health care professionals to reduce daily stressors.

About a year ago, the Powers Family was looking for a meaningful way to honor their sister Jane, a heart recipient who passed away in August 2021. At the dedication, Jane's brother, Jim spoke about Jane and the

person she was, stating, "Jane absolutely enjoyed her time at Lourdes and the lifetime friendships she made. After relocating to Arizona, she was diagnosed with congenital heart issues and ultimately was the recipient of a heart transplant." According to Jim, "Jane, a very active volunteer for the American Heart Association, passed peacefully, still optimistic, strong-spirited, and thinking of others every step of the way! Jane faced stress, anxiety, and moments of depression, but always connected with others for support and continued to believe in a better tomorrow."

According to a press release from Montgomery County Executive, Marc Elrich, "The Human Rights

Hall of Fame honors individuals who have made great personal sacrifices in contributing to human and civil rights in Montgomery County, either as trailblazers of the past or as current light bearers in the struggle. The honorees were recognized for their visionary leadership, outstanding achievements and altruism on the road to eliminating discrimination and advancing human rights."

"The newest inductees epitomize why the County's Human Rights Hall of Fame was created," said County Executive Elrich. "Many people contribute in so many ways to make Montgomery County a great place. Daryl Davis, Rev. Dr. Philip Davis Sr., Dr. Jeremiah Floyd, Janice Freeman, Willie Pearl Mackey King and Chuck Short are people who have dedicated their lives to doing just that, while also carving out paths that make our County more equitable and more fair."

The event also included performances from area students in the NAACP Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics (ACT-SO) and the Halley Shoenberg Trio.

An excerpt from the press release includes the following profile of Lourdes alumnus, Chuck Short '65.

Charles L. (Chuck) Short: Few people know the Montgomery County Government, and are more a part of its evolvement, than Chuck Short. He has 50 years of experience leading and administering local government,



private nonprofit and faith-based programs. His career has included 13 years of experience as senior advisor to two Montgomery County Executives; 20 years as an adjunct professor at the University of Maryland School of Public Policy; and 25 years as director of large direct service agencies. Currently, he is the senior advisor to the Montgomery County Superintendent of Schools and serves as a senior fellow to the Montgomery County Council. Each job he has held has put him in a better position to help people in his next position. From 1983 to 2002, he was the director of the County's health and human service agency. He then became the secretary for justice and service for the Archdiocese of

Washington, D.C. As secretary, he oversaw the Archdiocese's social concerns efforts that included nonprofit direct service agencies, parish-based programs, local, state and national legislative and policy advocacy, community organizations

and policy and program development. In 2019, Mr. Short founded Effective Kindness, LLC, which provides pro-bono technical and management advice to individuals and nonprofit organizations. He is the founding chair of the Montgomery County Collaboration Council for Children Youth and Families and was chair of the board of directors of, St Ann's Infant and Maternity Center. He has been presented with an endless list of awards for his service and dedication, among them the Community Advocate of the Year for Passion for Learning, Inc.; the Michele Heidenberger Volunteer Award from St Ann's Center for Children and Families: the S. Robert Cohen Award from the Jewish Foundation for Group Homes; the Phyllis Campbell Newsome Public Policy Leadership Award from the Center for Nonprofit Advancement; and the Distinguished Citizen of the Year Award from The Maryland Association of Non-Public Special Education Facilities. Chuck is a graduate of Georgetown University and The Catholic University of America.

Eligible students are invited to apply during their sophomore or junior year and are awarded at the beginning of the next school year.

Guests comprised of alumni, past and present clergy, administration, faculty, staff, and parents of the school came together to celebrate these honorees.





Brian Giorgis Retires from Marist College


Cheers to 21 Years and Over 400 Wins!

A Message from the Athletic Director, Matt Petruzzelli

It is with pleasure that I share with you a brief update on Warrior Athletics. As we reflect on the 2022-23 school year thus far, we have much to celebrate and be thankful for.

As most of you know, the Warriors made the jump from Section I to Section IX this past school year, hoping to find a new home where our student-athletes could participate in healthy competition year in and year out. The Warriors have flourished with the move, seeing success since the very first contest. In the fall season alone, numerous student-athletes were recognized for their individual efforts and accomplishments. We had six All-State selections, two Poughkeepsie Journal Players of the Year, and twenty-one Poughkeepsie Journal All-Stars. Two of our coaches were also recognized for their work. Boys Soccer Coach Roy Kievit and Football Coach Sean Keenan, '82, were both awarded with "Coach of the Year" honors in their respective sports. As programs, the Warriors earned multiple titles as well. Our Boys Soccer program led the way as MHAL Champions, Section IX Champions, and Class B state finalists. Following them were the Girls Tennis, Football, and Girls Soccer programs, who also won sectional titles. The Volleyball program put on a good showing as well, making it to the sectional title game.

The bar was set high after a stellar fall season as we prepared for winter sports competition. It started with a bang when junior Simone Pelish eclipsed 1,000 career points in the first game of the year. This milestone was followed by Coach Jim Santoro's 400th career win as head coach of the Warriors Boys Basketball team. The Girls and Boys Basketball programs saw great success this winter as they both made it to the sectional finals. For the boys this came after a great run where they won the MHAL title. The basketball programs have a lot of promise for the future as juniors Simone Pelish and Patrick Faughnan were named MHAL MVPs, and Faughnan got the nod as the Dutchess County Basketball Coaches Association MVP for the 2022-23 season. The Wrestling program had three wrestlers who placed third and one who placed fourth at the sectional meet, a great accomplishment for our young program. Our Indoor Track program also had a strong season with five

first-place finishes at the sectional meet in February and five athletes represented at the Nike National event for the 400m and 1600m Sprint Medley Relay.

The spring should be another exciting season for the Warriors as our teams have been working hard all winter in preparation for their upcoming seasons.

And while there has been so much to celebrate for our current student-athletes, we have also had the special opportunity to celebrate some of our former ones. Like most of the Lourdes community, we have been following the success story of former Warrior Maddy Siegrist '18 as she wraps up a historic career with the Villanova Wildcats. As a Warrior, Maddy was a two-time Poughkeepsie Journal Player of the Year and All-State selection leading the way for the Girls Basketball program. Maddy has done the same on the college stage, setting numerous records at Villanova and leading her team to the Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA March Madness tournament. Maddy's individual accomplishments include all-time leading scorer in Villanova basketball history (Men & Women), Big East single-game scoring record holder, Big East conference game all-time leading scorer, Philadelphia Big 5 all-time women's leading scorer, eclipsing 1,000 rebounds, and many more. We look forward to supporting Maddy as she continues her basketball career at the professional level as a member of the WNBA Dallas Wings!

Pioneer of Lourdes Athletics Passes Away

We are saddened to learn of the passing of Ed Donohue, a former faculty member, coach, and the very first Director of Athletics for Our Lady of Lourdes High School. According to his obituary, he passed away peacefully on January 8, 2023.

A graduate of the Poughkeepsie High School class of 1947, "Coach D", as he was known here at Lourdes, excelled in football, baseball and basketball. He went on to attend Niagara University on a football scholarship but only attended one year before being enlisted to serve in the US Air Force. In the Air Force, he continued to play all 3 sports for several years and upon completing his degrees (Bachelor's & Masters) at Syracuse University and then played semi-pro football for one year.

Coach D joined Our Lady of Lourdes High School in 1959 as a member of the faculty teaching General Science, Biology, Social Studies, and World History. He is most remembered, however, for establishing the first athletics program for our newly opened high school.

In 2011 we were honored to induct Coach D into our Athletic Hall of Fame. Coach D was part of the inaugural class that included athletic directors and coaches who went on to succeed him: Richard Beams, Brian Giorgis, and Cathy Kelly. During his acceptance speech he remarked, "I feel very close to Our Lady of Lourdes High School to this very day. It was a most life-developing and enjoyable experience dealing with the Marist Brothers and Dominican Sisters. Starting the basketball, football and baseball programs with no gymnasium, fields or equipment was not an easy task. Needless to say, we struggled through it."

Coach D left Lourdes in 1963 and went on to have a full and successful career at Niagara University and King's College.

We send our prayers and heartfelt condolences to the Donohue family. It is an honor to have his name forever a part of Lourdes history.
